

GUIDELINES FOR FAST AND ABSTI-NENCE DURING LENT: All are obliged by Canon Law to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday, from the age of 14 years throughout life. The law forbids the use of meat, but not of eggs, the products of milk, or condiments made of animal fat. All are obliged by Canon Law to fast—limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals in the course of the day-on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, from the age of 18 until the age of 59. The combined quantity of food at the two light meals should not exceed the quantity of food taken at the full The drinking of ordinary liquids does not break the fast. If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self-denial that are suitable to their condition.
